The primary task of this position is the coordination, management, and execution of high-performance training for athletes in the German national squad (OK, PK, NK1, EK male and/or female), with a specific focus on preparing them for the 2028/2032 Olympic Games. You will conduct daily training sessions for squad athletes in consultation with the respective national coach and the national training center manager. At national and international competitions, you will supervise the assigned athletes. Your role will also involve close collaboration with national and regional coaches of neighboring age groups, and, if necessary, representing or supporting them. The primary focus is on the further development of the German Judo Federation and its national training centers.

### **Qualifications:**

- Practical experience in high-performance sports training, as well as national/international success as a coach in youth and/or elite sports
- Experience with national and regional squad athletes and their environment; knowledge of the German elite sports structure is advantageous
- A degree in sports science or a comparable qualification is advantageous
- At least a DOSB Trainer-A License for high-performance sports (or an international equivalent) or the willingness to obtain it as soon as possible
- Willingness to work flexible hours, including weekends
- Exceptional commitment, high resilience, teamwork skills, and reliability
- Strong planning and communication skills
- Proficiency with modern communication tools and standard software
- A valid driver's license and a clean, extended criminal record certificate
- Familiarity with common MS Office programs
- German as the working language; English skills are desirable, both written and spoken

- Conducting daily training sessions at the assigned national training center Independent and results-oriented planning, management, execution, and analysis of training for assigned athletes and decentralized regional squad members in coordination and cooperation with the national coaches and the national training center manager at the national training center.
- Planning, organizing, executing, and following up on national and international measures in cooperation with the DJB.
- Supervising athletes at competitions and training events both domestically and internationally, as assigned by the DJB
- Results-oriented collaboration with national, regional, and club coaches
